

Bobbi Bloom


Co-Volunteer Coordinator

West Michigan Wildlife Center (WMWC) is a volunteer run nonprofit organization dedicated to providing West Michigan with reliable, high-quality resources for the rehabilitation of orphaned, abandoned, injured, or incapacitated wildlife. Located in the Grand Rapids area, we service and receive wildlife from the entire lower peninsula. Licensed by both the Michigan Department of Natural Resources and the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, WMWC offers professional and simple ways to guarantee the swift and humane return of wounded animals and migratory birds to their natural habitat.

Species accepted: Songbirds, Waterfowl/Shore birds, Corvids, Raptors, Opossums. Squirrels, Cottontails, Mustelids, Woodchuck, Muskrat, Fox, Reptiles, etc.

Species not currently accepted: Raccoons & Deer/Fawns

Species not allowed by law: Bats & Skunks











For our animals, the first 24 hours is hardest...






And they come in waves based on season...



We do not feed or house live prey – you will NOT be expected to kill "food" animals



Euthanasia

At the West Michigan Wildlife Center, we are committed to the well-being of all the animals in our care. We recognize that humane euthanasia is sometimes necessary to prevent suffering in certain patients who may be critically injured or terminally ill. Our team approaches this difficult decision with compassion and careful consideration, always prioritizing the welfare of the animal and adhering to ethical standards in wildlife rehabilitation.



IMPORTANT TO KNOW:



- O Submitting a volunteer application indicates your interest in contributing to our organization, but it does not guarantee acceptance. Each application is carefully reviewed based on our current needs, the roles available, and the qualifications of the applicants. We appreciate your enthusiasm and commitment to volunteering, and we will notify you about the outcome of your application as soon as possible.
- O You will be expected to commit to ONE 4-hour shift ONCE A WEEK for a minimum of 1 Year (some exceptions MAY be made for college students)
- O Along with your submitted volunteer application, a \$15 application fee is required. This fee covers various costs associated with processing your application, including a background check and administrative expenses. We appreciate your understanding, as this helps us ensure a safe and efficient volunteer experience for everyone involved.
- Once approved you will be invited to an Orientation where you can ask additional questions
